
- Call to order. The meeting was called to order by Terry Donaldson, NAML President at 3:50 p.m. EST. A quorum was present.

A revision of the size classes of NAML members was approved by the NAML Board of Directors on 4 Mar 2024 as follows.

General Guidelines about Size Classes. These descriptions are meant as general guidelines. Prospective members should discuss their size category with an officer or officers of the relevant regional organization as a part of the process of applying for membership. Some prospective members that are not traditional laboratories fit under the definition of regular membership and the size classes of these organizations are determined by the appropriate regional organization Board of Directors in consultation with the NAML Board of Directors.

■ Small Member Institution – \$832 Annual Dues

Fewer than 5 or no year-round scientists, director (or equivalent) or not, some staff, mostly seasonal use, mostly classes and field trips, low research activity.

- Medium Member Institution \$1,976 Annual Dues
 - Director (or equivalent), up to 20 scientists and staff, year-round operation, some funded research programs, may include visiting researchers.
- Large Member Institution \$3,120 Annual Dues
 Director (or equivalent), over 20 scientists and staff, year-round operation, many funded research programs, visiting researchers.

 - Major accomplishment this year is the production of a document <u>Best Practices in Field Safety & Accessibility</u>. This is an important document developed by the committee with input from the Education Committee. It is considered a living document as it can be easily updated as new information becomes available. The document is available on the NAML website Resources tab > Reports.
 - Audit Committee, Bob Richmond Chair, Michael Jacob, Nancy Smith submitted a
 report to the NAML Board of Directors on FY 2022 at its 7 Dec 2023 meeting. The report
 was accepted by the Board. The committee conducts an official examination and
 verification of accounts and records of the Association annually. The chair presents a
 report on the Association's finances and record-keeping to the Board of Directors at least
 once per year.
 - Public Policy Committee, Dave Eggleston, Chair
 - The committee produced a conference letter on 30 Oct 2024 in support of the funding priorities of NOAA, NSF, and NASA for FY 2025 appropriations. This conference letter and all such documents are available on the NAML website under the Public Policy tab > Documents, Letters, Positions; https://www.naml.org/policy/documents.php.
 - The committee worked on the agenda for this winter meeting. The chair acknowledged the hard work of Alli Hays and Meg Thompson, Federal Science Partners for their contributions.
 - The committee is now working on the Public Policy Priorities for 2024-2025.
 - The committee is now also considering a draft **white paper on marine aquaculture** initiated by Hubbs-Seaworld, a NAML member.

- The Public Policy Priorities and documents such as white papers must first be approved by the Public Policy Committee and then the NAML Board of Directors.
- The committee is also interested in reviving the NAML Briefings on the Hill (see NAML website > Public Policy > Briefings on the Hill; https://www.naml.org/policy/briefings.php. Congressional Briefings are opportunities to outside organizations educate members of congress on particular topics. NAML must work with a congressional office or caucus to sponsor such briefings. NAML has had successful briefings in the past.
 - Clarissa Anderson, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, suggested that another option might be to sponsor simpler roundtable discussions for staffers.
- The committee will put the formalization of NAML's Public Policy Priorities on a two-year cycle.
- Impacts of a Position Paper Lessons Learned from Fukushima by Rob Richmond. This topic was published as a position paper on 12 Dec 2022 by NAML.See NAML website > Public Policy > Documents, Letters, Positions.
 - Bob Richmond discussed with the group the general strategies for drafting public policy bills and interacting with members of congress. In general, this is bridging science to policy and then to action.
